## Main Components of a Grant Application

#### 1. Boiler Plate & Basics

- Name / Contact Info / Web & Social
- Mission / Vision
- Experience as Artist / History of Organization / Past Activities
- Project Location Location Location! (Important in Placemaking)
- Requested Grant Amount
- 2. The Narrative the "What" and "Who for"
  - ► Goals / Objectives / Activities of the Project / Audience / The Need
  - More Background on Organization / Artist (if not in previous section)
- 3. Supporting Sections the "How"
  - Timeline/Schedule of Activities; Resumes/Bios; Budget
- 4. Attachments
  - Financials, Resumes, Budget, Certifications, Proof of Past Work, et al.

## The Narrative: Telling the Story

**Goals:** Eagle-Eye View, The Big Picture, Impact What change in the world are you hoping to achieve?

**Objectives** More specific than "goals"

Activities/Tasks/Description

More specific than "objectives"

### Audience / Who Served / Who Benefits

- Who is benefitting from your work, specifically, and how?
- Quantities
- Qualities
  - Age" "Fifth graders"...
  - Group Identity: "Single parents"
  - Demographic: "New Bedford residents"
  - Affiliation: "students of Gideon Elementary School"
- Data
  - Census, School Profiles, Economic, Studies of the Demographic, etc.

### The Need

- Placemaking or Place keeping Need
  - Bringing attention to an overlooked space
  - Drawing out an overlooked quality or aspect of that place
  - Building on the existing cultural identity of that place
  - Helping create pride of place
  - Active care and maintenance of a place by people who live/work there
- Economic, Social, Cultural, Educational, etc.
- NOT your personal needs unless a specific artist development grant
- Should match the grant purpose

# **Supporting Information**

- Timeline of activities
- Credentials of people involved
- The itemized project budget
- Evaluation methods

#### Attachments

- Financials (audit, 990, operating budget, or1040)
- Project budget, resumes/bios
- Proof of past work: photos, flyers, testimonials, artworks
- Signed certifications: "I attest to the truth"
